EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 400

Relating to the Amendment of Executive Order No. 398

WHEREAS, a State of Emergency was declared in Executive Order No. 398 for Adams, Columbia, Crawford, Dane, Dodge, Grant, Green, Iowa, Juneau, LaCrosse, Lafayette, Monroe, Richland, Rock, Sauk and Vernon Counties in the State of Wisconsin due to damage caused by severe storms with high-winds, hail and intense rain starting on May 26, 2000 and extending for numerous days thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the State of Emergency declared by Executive Order No. 398 was amended by Executive Order No. 399 to include Jackson, Kenosha and Walworth Counties which were also severely impacted by these extremely severe storms; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County was also severely impacted by these extremely severe storms, with high-winds, hail, intense rain and tornadoes; and

WHEREAS, in all the aforementioned counties, severe weather has continued past the original 30 day emergency period;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by sections 166.03(1)(b)1 and 21.11(1) of the Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby amend Executive Order No. 398 to provide that a State of Emergency exists in Milwaukee County and extend the emergency period for an additional 30 days for all aforementioned counties.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this seventh day of July in the year two thousand.
