EXECUTIVE ORDER #284

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Former Wisconsin Attorney General Peggy "Peg" Lautenschlager

WHEREAS, on March 31, 2018, former Wisconsin Attorney General Peggy "Peg" Lautenschlager passed away at the age of 62; and

WHEREAS, Attorney General Peg Lautenschlager was elected Wisconsin Attorney General in 2002, becoming the first female attorney general in Wisconsin history and serving from 2003 to 2007; and

WHEREAS, Attorney General Peg Lautenschlager served Wisconsin for over three decades, serving as District Attorney of Winnebago County from 1985 to 1988, a member of the Wisconsin Assembly from 1989 to 1993, and U.S. Attorney for the Western District of Wisconsin from 1993 to 2001; and

WHEREAS, Attorney General Peg Lautenschlager was a dedicated public servant, and the people of Wisconsin mourn her passing; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service for Attorney General Peg Lautenschlager will be held on Sunday, April 15, 2018;

NOW THEREFORE, I, SCOTT WALKER, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin, beginning at sunrise on **Sunday, April 15, 2018**, and ending at sunset on that date.


