



1995 SENATE BILL 101

March 8, 1995 - Introduced by Senators PETAK and FARROW, cosponsored by Representatives KAUFERT, GOETSCH, BRANDEMUEHL, JENSEN, AINSWORTH, DUFF, LADWIG, NASS, DOBYNS and HUEBSCH. Referred to Committee on State Government Operations and Corrections.

1 **AN ACT to create** 19.42 (4m) and 19.45 (8m) of the statutes; **relating to:** service
2 by a former constitutional officer or member of the legislature as a lobbyist.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits any individual who serves as a constitutional officer or as a member of the legislature, for 12 months following the date on which the individual ceases to hold office, from being employed as a lobbyist. "Constitutional officer" includes the governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state treasurer, attorney general and state superintendent of public instruction. A "lobbyist" means an individual who is compensated by a principal and whose duties include attempting to influence state legislative action or state administrative rule-making action on behalf of the principal, except that an individual whose duties on behalf of a principal are not limited exclusively to lobbying is a "lobbyist" only if the individual makes lobbying communications on each of at least 5 days during a 6-month reporting period.

Violators are subject to a forfeiture (civil penalty) of not more than \$5,000 for each violation. Intentional violators are subject to a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$5,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year or both for each violation (a misdemeanor).
