2 Whereas, approximately 46,000 Wisconsin youths are active participants in the
3 Wisconsin 4-H youth development program; and

4 Whereas, the Wisconsin 4-H youth development program is part of a
5 nationwide effort providing a wealth of opportunities to rural and urban youths by
6 providing them with supportive environments to enhance their personal
7 development and leadership skills; and

8 Whereas, Wisconsin's youths are leaders in the nation with their participation
9 in citizenship and civic education programs that enable them to enrich and improve
10 the environment and their communities through public service; and

11 Whereas, Wisconsin 4-H is leading the nation by pledging over 213,000 hours
12 of additional community service in honor of the National 4-H Centennial
13 Celebration; now, therefore, be it

14 **Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That** the Wisconsin
15 legislature commends the Wisconsin 4-H youths who have enhanced the quality of

1 life for Wisconsin citizens by their involvement in the Wisconsin 4-H youth
2 development program and by continuing to be leaders in the nation in their
3 dedication to public service.
