



2007 ASSEMBLY BILL 951

March 11, 2008 – Introduced by Representatives TRAVIS and BOYLE. Referred to Joint Committee on Finance.

1 **AN ACT to repeal and recreate** 40.05 (4) (a) 2. of the statutes; **relating to:**
2 employer payment of health insurance premiums for state employees.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Currently, the state pays employer contributions toward health insurance premiums for most state employees beginning on the first day of the seventh month after the employee begins state employment. Beginning on July 1, 2008, the state will pay employer contributions toward health insurance for all state employees, other than limited term appointments, beginning on the first day of the third month after the employee begins state employment. This bill requires the state to pay employer contributions toward health insurance premiums for all state employees beginning on the day on which the employee becomes insured, which is usually the first day of the first month after the employee begins state employment.
