1 **Relating to:** commemorating the 80th anniversary of the Japanese attack on Pearl
2 Harbor.

3 Whereas, on December 7, 1941, the Empire of Japan launched a surprise attack
4 on the United States at the American naval base at Pearl Harbor in Hawaii; and

5 Whereas, a total of 2,403 Americans were killed and 1,178 Americans were
6 wounded during the attack; and

7 Whereas, a total of 19 warships were damaged or destroyed from the attack;
8 and

9 Whereas, a total of 328 Navy and Army Air Corps aircraft were damaged or
10 destroyed from the attack; and

11 Whereas, the attack on Pearl Harbor prompted President Franklin D.
12 Roosevelt to deliver his 'Day of Infamy Speech' to a joint session of the 77th United
13 States Congress; and

14 Whereas, Congress passed a formal declaration of war against Japan less than
15 an hour later; and
