AN ACT to authorize the Supervisors of Brown County to raise money for certain improvements, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

Sapervisors to levy one per cent.

SECTION 1. That the supervisors of Brown county, shall have power and they are hereby required to levy a tax not exceeding one per cent, per annum annually, for the purpose of constructing a McAdam, plank, rail or turnpike road, from the foot of the Grand Kakalin to Winnebago Lake as may be deemed most expedient.

The said tax shall be levied and collected at the same

and collected time, and in the same manner that taxes are by law required to be levied for the support of county government, in said county; and said tax shall be a lien on real estate on which the same is or may be assessed until paid: Provided, however, that the tax authorized to be collected by this act, shall be paid in money to the several collectors, and paid by them in like funds to the county tressurer.

The said board of supervisors are hereby authorized SEC. 3. and required to appropriate all the moneys raised in pursuance of this act, to the purposes herein expressed, and no other. the said board are further authorized to cause such road to be located, and surveyed by persons appointed by them, and having determined upon the location and survey, and upon the kind of improvement to be constructed, to give out contracts for the construction thereof, as they may deem most for the interest of said county: Provided, however, that the cost and location of such survey, and other expenses attending the same shall not exceed one hundred dollars.
