SEC. 5. Said association shall keep a full and complete Records to be record of all ordinances, bye-laws, rules, and regulations, kept. made by them, and shall keep a full and complete record of all notices and elections, and a full record of all the names of such persons as shall become, or be elected officers of said association, and said record shall be received in all courts as competent evidence of all facts therein stated.
