

Chap. 95.

AN ACT concerning *Treasurers*.

Published, June 1, 1854.

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

§ 1. It is hereby made the duty of every county treasurer to keep a full, true, and correct account of all moneys by him received for taxes paid to him, and upon redemption of lands from sales thereof for the non-payment of taxes in which amount shall be stated the name of the person or officer who and for whom the money is paid, the time when, and a description of the property whereon the taxes were to such treasurer paid.

Treasurer to keep account of taxes, and person for whom paid.

§ 2. It shall be the duty of the clerk of the county board of supervisors, who is hereby declared to be the county clerk, to keep an account in like manner as is provided in the preceding section, as to all moneys by him paid over to the county treasurer; and also as to all moneys by him received for the redemption of land from sales thereof, and also as to all moneys that he may receive in his official capacity for any purpose or in any amount whatsoever.

Clerk of county board to keep a similar account.

§ 3. The accounts so as aforesaid kept shall be and are hereby declared to be public records.

§ 4. This act shall take effect upon being printed after the passage thereof.
