

sum sufficient to pay each clergyman officiating as chaplain at the present session of the legislature, for such service, twenty-five dollars.

SECTION 2. The chief clerks of the senate and assembly shall deliver to each of said clergymen a certificate of such service, and such certificate shall be sufficient authority for the payment of such amount by the state treasurer. Duties of chief clerks.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 253.

[Published April 25, 1861.]

AN ACT to amend Section 18 of Chapter 199 of the Private Laws of 1859, entitled "An act to establish a municipal court in the city and county of Milwaukee."

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 18 of chapter 199 of the private and local laws of 1859, is hereby amended by adding after the words "properly chargeable to either the said county or city," the following: "Which certificates if chargeable to the county, shall be received by the treasurer of said county of Milwaukee, in payment of county taxes, in the year for which such certificates are offered in payment." Certificates of clerk for fees, receivable for taxes
