west, and the north line of section twenty-nine, in township thirty-one, north of range nineteen west, over any part or the whole of the distance within the points named, as shall be required for the purposes of said company, and which shall be called the 'Apple river boom,' and shall be constructed and ready for use on or before the 10th day of June, 1863. Into said boom all logs and the timber floating down the said Apple river shall be gathered and secured by said company, and all such logs and timber shall be turned out of said boom within thirty days after the same shall come into the possession of said company, unless otherwise agreed between the owners of such logs and timber and said company."

CHAPTER 313.

[Published April 28, 1863.]

AN ACT for the organization of the Greenwood cemetery association.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Notice of meeting for election of trustees.

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for Duncan McGregor, Francis Pomeroy, L. N. Powell, William Lozer and S. M. Davis, or a majority of them, to cause a public notice to be printed in the Citizens' Reporter, a weekly newspaper published at River Falls, Pierce county, Wisconsin, for three successive weeks, or to post notices containing notice of the time when and the place where a public meeting will be held by the owners of lots in the grounds of the late Greenwood cemetery association, for the purpose of reorganizing the same. Such meeting, when so convened, shall have the power to elect, by ballot, six trustees, who shall hold their term of office in accordance with and be governed by the rules and regulations that governed the former trustees of the association.

SECTION 2. It shall be competent for the said trustees, when elected in accordance with section one of this act, to give deeds of lots in the grounds of said association, and do all acts and perform all duties that may properly be done or performed by the trustees of similar associations organized under the law of this state. Powers of trustees.

SECTION 3. Any deed or certificate conveying any lot in the grounds of the said Greenwood cemetery association, and bearing the signature of any former president of said association, shall be deemed valid in law, and such deed or certificate shall be accepted as *bona fide* title to the same. Deeds not void, &c.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 315.

[Published April 28, 1863.]

AN ACT to incorporate the Hartford hook and ladder company, at Hartford, in the county of Washington.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Hopewell Cox, Herman A. Kusel, Cris-
tover Coerper, Francis Christmacht and Phillip Loos, and their associates, are hereby created a body corporate and politic, under the name and style of the "Hartford hook and ladder company," located in the village of Hartford, in the county of Washington, [Washington.] Corporators.
Name and location.

SECTION 2. The said corporation shall have power to contract and be contracted with, to sue and to be sued, to plead and to be impleaded (*with*), to defend and to be defended, in all courts of law and equity in this state, and shall have perpetual succession, and be vested with all the powers and privileges necessary to carry out and fulfill the objects of their corporation, indicated by its corporate name.
