

CHAPTER 235.

[Published May 8, 1865.]

AN ACT to provide for the punishment of certain offenses against school houses, churches and other public buildings.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Any person who shall willfully injure, deface or damage any school house, church or other public building within this state, shall, on conviction thereof, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding three months, or by both fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

Punishment for injury to school houses, churches, &c.

SECTION 2. Justices of the peace shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the circuit court, of the offense mentioned in section one of this act.

Jurisdiction of Justices.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 236.

[Published May 8, 1865.]

AN ACT to legalize the proceedings of a special town meeting called and held for the purpose of raising bounty money for volunteers, in the town of Calamus, in the county of Dodge.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. All the proceedings had prior to and at a certain special town meeting or election held in the town of Calamus, in the county of Dodge, on the 25th day of August, A. D. 1864, and the tax voted to be raised to pay bounties to volunteers, are hereby declared to be legal and valid for all purposes whatsoever.

Bounty tax proceedings legalized.
