CHAPTER 90.

AN ACT relating to depositions, and to amend chapter 267 of the general laws of 1864, entitled "an act relating to depositions."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

When deposition may be used on trial of any action.

Section 1. Section one of chapter 267 of the general laws of 1864, entitled "an act relating to depositions," is hereby amended, by adding thereto as follows: "Any deposition taken during the term of court at which a cause may be tried, which shall be taken by stipulation, or on due notice to the opposite party, may be used on the trial of any action: provided, the same shall be filed with the clerk of the court before the commencement of the trial, and the opposite party shall be notified of the filing of such deposition.

SECTION 2. So much of any act as conflicts with the

provisions of this act, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 91.

AN ACT to amend section 31 of chapter 184 of the revised statutes, entitled "of executions, and proceedings supplementary thereto."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Inventions exempt from sale on executions. SECTION 1. Section 31 of chapter 134 of the revised statutes of the state of Wisconsin is hereby amended, so as to include in the exemptions from execution or sale on final process issued by any court in this state against any inventor, all inventions of any such inventor secured to him or her by letters patent of the United States.
