

## CHAPTER 87.

[Published March 22, 1870.]

AN ACT to provide for the apportionment of school moneys to towns in certain cases.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The boards of supervisors of those towns which have not raised by order of the county boards of supervisors, a sum sufficient to entitle them to an apportionment of school moneys for the year 1870, are hereby authorized and directed to transfer from the general fund to the school fund of their respective towns, the amounts in which said towns are deficient; and upon the receipt by the state superintendent of public instruction of the certificate of any town clerk that the requisite amount has been thus transferred, he shall apportion to said towns the full sum of school moneys to which such towns would have been entitled, provided the county boards had levied upon such town the amounts required by law. <sup>May transfer fund.\*</sup>

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 88.

[Published March 23, 1870.]

AN ACT to provide for the recovery of taxes unlawfully assessed and collected.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Any person aggrieved by the levy and collection of any unlawful tax assessed against him in <sup>May maintain action.</sup>
