

CHAPTER 10.

AN ACT changing the time of holding the general terms of the circuit court for Sauk county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. From and after the first day of February, 1872, the general terms of the circuit court in and for the county of Sauk, in this state, shall be held as follows, to-wit: On the fourth Monday of September, and on the third Monday of March, in each year, instead of the terms of said court now appointed by law for holding said court in said county. Terms fixed.

SECTION 2. All writs, services, process, continuances, proceedings, returns and recognizances made, commenced, had or entered into, in and from said circuit court for Sauk county, and all proceedings pending therein or returnable thereto, whether by recognizance or otherwise, and all actions and proceedings which may be instituted in said court, shall be taken and held as returnable and continued to the term of said court to be held on the fourth Monday of September, 1872. Writs returnable to the September term.

SECTION 3. All laws conflicting with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
