

CHAPTER 121.

[Published April 4, 1872.]

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter forty-nine of the general laws of 1870, entitled "an act to provide for a course of instruction in the state normal schools for certain pupils of the Soldiers' Orphans' Home."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter forty-nine (49) ^{Amended.} of the general laws of 1870, entitled "an act to provide for a course of instruction in the state normal schools for certain pupils of the Soldiers' Orphans' Home," is hereby amended by adding thereto, as follows: "*provided*, that if the president of such normal school shall designate annually a number (not exceeding three) of such pupils who have been in attendance upon school two years, as manifesting unusual excellence in scholarship, and peculiar talent and qualifications for teaching, the board of trustees of the Soldiers' Orphans' Home may continue such pupils in such normal school until they have finished the course of instruction at such school. ^{May continue pupils.}

CHAPTER 122.

AN ACT to provide compensation for opening the present session, and for indexing and completing the transcribing of the journals of the senate and assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to J. H. Waggoner, chief clerk of the senate, out of any money in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, for indexing the senate journal of the present session, ^{Appropriated to chief clerk of senate.}
