

CHAPTER 94.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and eighty-two of the general laws of 1869, entitled "an act to establish a township system of school government."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amended.

SECTION 1. Section eight (8) of chapter one hundred and eighty-two of the general laws of 1869, entitled "an act to establish a township system of school government," is hereby amended to read as follows: the members of the board, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum, assembled at the first and each succeeding annual meeting, shall elect from their number a president and vice president and a secretary, who may or may not be one of their number: *provided*, he shall be a resident of the town to which the board belongs. The said secretary shall receive compensation for services rendered at not less than two dollars nor more than three dollars per diem; and shall present a statement of services rendered, at the annual meeting of the board.

Shall elect officers.

SECTION 2. Section thirty-seven (37) of said chapter one hundred and eighty-two, is hereby amended by the addition of the following words: "*provided*, that the system of township school government shall continue in force two years from the date of its adoption, before the question of abolishing it shall be acted upon, as heretofore provided."

Shall be in force two years.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
