

ject to said rules and regulations, and shall make an annual report to the common council.

SECTION 5. Said firemen's relief fund shall be kept separate and apart from other moneys of said city, and shall be drawn out upon the order of said trustees, or a majority of them, countersigned by the chief engineer of said fire department.

Relief fund to be kept separate; how drawn, etc.

SECTION 6. Any member of said fire department who shall be discharged for any cause or reason other than neglect of duty, shall receive, upon his discharge, the amount which may have been deducted from him for the purposes herein named, less such sum or sums as may have been received by him from said fire relief fund.

Money to be refunded.

SECTION 7. All acts and parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 38.

AN ACT for the relief of Babetta Silverfriend, widow of M. Silverfriend.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Babetta Silverfriend, widow of M. Silverfriend, from the general fund, out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, the sum of thirty-five dollars, being that part of license money paid into the state treasury May 29, 1877, by said M. Silverfriend, now deceased, for a license to travel and trade within this state, with two horses and wagon, which was not earned at the time of his death.

Appropriation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.
