CHAPTER 407.

AN ACT to amend chapter 62, laws of 1883, entitled, "An act relating to the preservation of fish in the lakes, bayous and sloughs of the Mississippi River.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Preservation of fish in the sloughs of the Mississippi.

SECTION 1. Section 1, of chapter 62, of the laws of 1883, is hereby amended by inserting after the word, "lakes," in the second line of said section the words, "except Lake Pepin" so that said section when so amended shall read as follows: Section 1. Any person who shall catch or take from the lakes (except Lake Pepin), bayous or sloughs directly leading into the Mississippi River, or from the Mississippi River, within the limits of the state of Wisconsin, any fish, except mullets, suckers, bill fish, bull heads or dog-fish, by the use of any device other than by spear, hook and line or angling, shall be punished by a fine not more than fifty dollars; and any seine, net or other device so used shall be forfeited to the state. Provided, that this act shall not be construed to prevent any person from catching minnows for bait.

SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts, inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.
