CHAPTER 185.

AN ACT to provide against the practice of deception in articles of food.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Any person who shall knowingly make, traffic and sell olio-butter, butterine or any other imitation of butter or cheese, or who shall knowingly keep upon his table in any hotel, restaurant or boarding-house, any imitation butter, shall make the same fully known to the buyer, by posting up notices of the fact at, and in the place where such articles are for sale or for consumption.

Notice of the fact of sale or use of olio-butter, butt-rine or any imitation of butter or cheese to be posted in place of sale or consumption.

SECTION 2. Any person who shall omit posting up such notice, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not more than thirty days, or by fine not to exceed twenty-five dollars.

Penalty for failure to post notice.

SECTION 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 186.

AN ACT to amend chapter 50, of the revised statutes, entitled, "of lands sold for taxes."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1170, of chapter 50, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following proviso, at the end of said

section as heretofore amended, viz: Provided, that no county clerk shall be liable to any penalty or to the forfeiture of any sum whatever, for causing such publication to be made in a weekly newspaper published in such county, for two years or more next prior to the date of such county clerk's notice, when by reason of accident or other cause more than one week has intervened between the dates of its actual issue to subscribers, if such delay at any one time shall not have exceeded three days. But every such newspaper, for all the purposes of this section, shall be deemed to have been regularly published once in each week, as hereinbefore provided.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 187.

AN ACT to amend section 604, chapter 32, revised statutes, relating to sheriff's fees for removing persons to the insane asylums.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Amend section 604, chapter 32, revised statutes, by striking out the word, "five," where it occurs in said section, and insert in place thereof the word, "ten," so that said section when amended shall read as follows: Section 604. The sheriff shall be allowed the following fees: For arresting and bringing a person charged with insanity before the county judge and subpoenaing witnesses, the same fees as are allowed in other cases; for taking an insane person to the hospital or removing one therefrom, ten cents per mile going and returning, and six cents per mile going and returning for each assistant, and one dollar
