CHAPTER 230.

AN ACT to amend chapter 138, of the laws of 1885, entitled, "an act to amend section 1365, chapter 54, of the revised statutes of 1878, as amended by chapter 205, of the laws of 1881, relating to drains."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Chapter 138, of the laws of 1885, Amending ch. 138, laws 1885. entitled, "an act to amend section 1365, chapter 54, of the revised statutes of 1878, as amended by chapter 205, of the laws of 1881, relating to drains," is hereby amended by inserting after section 1, of said chapter, the following, to be known as section 2: Whenever it shall be made to appear by affidavit or other satisfactory proof, under oath, to the town boards of supervisors of each of two adjoining towns that such joint application cannot with due diligence be obtained, and that it is necessary that a ditch or drain be straightened, enlarged or constructed partly or wholly in or through either of said towns for the purpose of making a suitable outlet into some natural stream or water-course for any town drains or ditch already constructed, partly or wholly in either of said adjoining towns, and that there is no other more practicable outlet, the application provided for in the preceding section may be made by any six or more freeholders residing in either of said towns, in writing, and in duplicate, to the supervisors of both of said towns, in the same manner as provided in the preceding section, and the said supervisors shall act upon such application in the same manner as provided in said section.

SECTION 2. Sections 2 and 3, of said chapter 138, of the laws of 1885, shall be numbered sections 3 and 4, respectively. Changing number of sections.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
