CHAPTER 108.

AN ACT to fix the time of holding the terms of court in the sixteenth judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Terms of court
in the sixteenth
judicial circuit.

SECTION 1. From and after July 1, 1895, the terms of court for the sixteenth judicial circuit shall be held as follows: For the county of Marathon, the first Monday in May and the second Monday in November. For the county of Lincoln, the fourth Monday in February and the third Monday in September. For the county of Oneida, the first Monday after the first Tuesday in April and the second Monday in October. Every general term in each of said counties shall be a special term for all the other counties in said circuit.

SECTION 2. Chapter 10, of the laws of Wisconsin for the year 1893, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1895.
