**CHAPTER 222.**

AN ACT to authorize the state board of control to settle a question of disputed boundary of lands appurtenant to the home for feeble-minded in Chippewa county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:*

**Description of disputed lands; maximum price.** SECTION 1. Whereas the state is the owner of certain lands in sections four and nine, township twenty-eight, range eight west, in the county of Chippewa, and Archie McKinnon is the owner of certain other lands in sections three and ten of the township and range aforesaid adjoining said lands of the state; and whereas there is a controversy between said McKinnon and the state as to the true location of the section line between sections four and nine and sections three and ten, the line between the lands of said McKinnon and the state; now therefore the state board of control is hereby authorized to compromise said controversy with the said McKinnon and to pay him in settlement thereof a sum not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars, and to execute any release or other instrument necessary to carry out such compromise.

**Appropriating clause.** SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the general fund of the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay said McKinnon the amount which the board of control may agree to pay him pursuant to this act.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
