

either electric light or power, or both, not only to such city or village and its inhabitants but also to *persons, firms, corporations*, dwellings or places of business outside the boundaries of such city or village by means of a line or lines or poles and wires extended outside of or into said boundaries.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 435.

AN ACT to amend subdivision (d) of section 1087m-3 and subdivision (h) of section 1087m-4 of the statutes, relating to income tax.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subdivision (d) of section 1087m-3 and subdivision (h) of section 1087m-4 of the statutes are amended to read: (Section 1087m-3) (d) Sums paid by such person within the year for taxes imposed upon the source from which the income taxed by this act is derived by any state of this union or subdivision thereof, or any territory or possession of the United States, or the United States government as income, excess profits or war profits taxes. * * *

(Section 1087m-4) (h) Taxes upon the property or business from which the income hereby taxed is derived paid by such persons during the year other than inheritance taxes, including therein taxes imposed by the United States government as income, excess profits and war profits taxes. * * *

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 436.

AN ACT to amend subsection (3) of section 29.62 of the statutes, relating to the removal and sale of injurious rough fish, and providing that such fish be sold to municipalities.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (3) of section 29.62 of the statutes is amended to read: (3) All fish taken under the authority of this section, including rough fish and fish from which the spawn

is removed, shall be disposed of by the commission to * * * municipalities conducting public markets. Any surplus remaining after said municipalities are supplied may be disposed of by the commission to the best interests of the state; and temporary fish ponds may be created in the waters of this state for the purpose of keeping such fish until the same can be advantageously disposed of.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 437.

AN ACT to amend subsection 2 of section 656 of the statutes, relating to the construction of county buildings.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 2 of section 656 of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 656) (2) In the construction hereafter of any courthouse the following restrictions and limitations shall be observed:

* * *

* * * (a) Such construction shall be in accordance with plans and specifications accompanied by the certificate of the judge of the circuit court in whose circuit the building is to be erected, to the effect that after consultation with competent experts he is advised and believes that the court rooms therein provided for will possess proper acoustical properties. The expense of such expert advice shall be paid out of the county treasury upon the certificate of such judge.

(b) Repairs which amount substantially to a reconstruction of a courthouse shall be governed by the same restrictions and limitations, as far as practicable.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
