CHAPTER 535.

AN ACT to amend subsection 1 of section 1729m of the statutes, relating to public highways and bridges.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 1 of section 1729m of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 1729m) 1. Each and every contract hereafter made for the erection, construction, remodeling or repairing of any public building or works, *except contracts for the construction or maintenance of public highways and bridges*, to which the state or any officer or agent thereof is a party, which may involve the employment of laborers, workmen or mechanics, shall contain a stipulation that no laborer, workman or mechanic in the employ of the contractor, subcontractor, agent or other person, doing or contracting to do all or a part of the work contemplated by the contract, shall be permitted to work more than eight hours in any one calendar day, except in cases of extraordinary emergencies.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 536.

AN ACT to amend subsection 3 of section 1897a and subdivision (2) of subsection 12 of section 1960 of the statutes, relating to life insurance.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 3 of section 1897a and subdivision (2) of subsection 12 of section 1960 of the statutes are amended to read: (Section 1897a) 3. Insurance under each subsection of section 1897 shall be written in separate and distinct policies, except that the same policy may embrace risks specified in subsections 1 and 12, 7 and 10, or 4 and 5, and policies under subsection 3 may contain any provision operating to safeguard the
