JOINT RESOLUTION

To amend section 21 of article IV of the constitution, relating to compensation of members of the legislature.

---

*Resolved by the Assembly, the Senate concurring, That section 21 of article IV of the constitution, be amended to read: (Article IV) Section 21. Each member of the legislature shall receive for his services \* \* \* such sum \* \* \* to be paid at such times and in such manner as shall be prescribed by law. The compensation prescribed for members of the legislature immediately prior to the adoption of this amendment shall continue in force until changed by the legislature in a manner consistent with the other provisions of this constitution.*

*Resolved further, That this proposed amendment be referred to the legislature to be chosen at the next general election, and that the same shall be published for three months previous to the time of holding such election.*
