Such officer shall then issue a certificate in the following form :

CHAPTER 111.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum therein named to compensate members of Ambulance Company Number One Eighty-Five of the One Hundred Thirty-Fifth Medical Regiment, Wisconsin National Guard, for clothing destroyed by fire while in camp.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund one thousand three hundred thirty-four dollars and seventy-five cents to compensate members of Ambulance Company Number One Eighty-Five of the One Hundred Thirty-Fifth Medical Regiment,

Wisconsin National Guard, for clothing destroyed by fire while in camp. This amount to be distributed as follows:
