**CHAPTER 178.**

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 40.64 of the statutes, relating to the establishment of a union high school in island townships.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 40.64 of the statutes is amended to read: (40.64) (1) A high school district may be established in any contiguous compact territory (outside of cities) having an area of not less than thirty-six nor more than seventy-two square miles, with an assessed valuation of one million two hundred and fifty thousand dollars or more. *A high school district or a consolidated free high school district may also be established in any township comprising only island territory.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

**CHAPTER 179.**

AN ACT to repeal subsection (4) of section 23.11 and to create section 23.25 of the statutes, relating to a state geographic board.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Subsection (4) of section 23.11 of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 2. A new section is added to the statutes to read: 23.25 (1) The state geographic board shall consist of the conservation director, the state geologist, and the state chief engineer. The conservation director shall be the secretary and executive officer of the board, and the conservation commission shall be its administrative agent.

(2) It shall be the duty of the state geographic board and it shall have power and authority:
