CHAPTER 42.

AN ACT to extend the date for payment of taxes by a local treasurer to the county treasurer to April 10, 1933.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The last date for the payment of taxes to the town, city and village treasurers and the return of warrants and tax rolls by such treasurers to county treasurers and the payment of the sums directed to be paid to such county treasurers as provided by subsections (1) and (3) of section 70.68 and subsection (1) of section 74.15 is extended to April 10, 1933.

SECTION 2. It is declared that the provisions of this act are made necessary by the present economic emergency, resulting in the closing of all banks, and the consequent inability of citizens to pay taxes.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 43.

AN ACT to create paragraph (c) of subsection (4) of section 5.27, created by chapter 27, Laws 1933, and to re-enact paragraph (c) of subsection (8) of section 5.26, 1931, Wisconsin statutes, relating to town primaries in counties of two hundred fifty thousand population or over.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new paragraph is added to subsection (4) of section 5.27, created by chapter 27, Laws 1933, to read:

(5.27) (4) (c) The ballot provided for in paragraph (b) shall have printed on the back thereof the following:

OFFICIAL TOWN PRIMARY BALLOT

For

..... Precinct,

Town of

Milwaukee County

.....

Ballot Clerks.

We certify that the within ballot was marked by us for an elector incapable under the law of marking his own ballot and as directed by him.

NOTE: Chapter 27, Laws 1933, makes no provision for an indorsement upon the ballot there created.

SECTION 2. Paragraph (c) of subsection (8) of section 5.26 is re-enacted as printed in the 1931 Wisconsin statutes.

NOTE: Chapter 27, Laws 1933, amended said subsection (8) of section 5.26 but inadvertently omitted paragraph (c). The purpose is to make it plain that paragraph (c) has not been repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

AN ACT to create section 6.245 and to amend subsection (2) of section 348.201 of the statutes, relating to the recall of elective officers, and providing a penalty.
