CHAPTER 454.

AN ACT to amend section 29.191, as amended by chapter 98, laws 1933, paragraph (1) of subsection (1) of section 29.28, as amended by chapter 98, laws 1933, subsection (5) of section 59.98, as amended by chapter 128, laws 1933, subsection (7) of section 66.04, as amended by chapters 170 and 175, laws 1933, subsection (2) of section 72.04, as amended by chapter 275, laws 1933, paragraph (b) of subsection (9) of section 157.11, as amended by chapters 134 and 246, laws 1933, subsection (8) of section 208.25, as enacted in section 25 of chapter 344, laws 1933, and subsection (1) of section 326.01, as amended by chapter 253, laws 1933; to repeal paragraph (o) of subsection (1) of section 29.28, as amended by chapter 98, laws 1933, paragraph (p) of subsection (2) of section 29.28, as created by chapter 98, laws 1933, and paragraph (j) of subsection (2g) of section 29.28, created by chapter 98, laws 1933, and section 102.45; to renumber subsection (2) of section 50.07, as amended by chapter 277, laws 1933; and to re-enact paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 50.07, as created by chapter 234, laws 1933, all for the purpose of correcting errors, reconciling conflicts and supplying omissions.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 29.191, as amended by chapter 98, Laws 1933, is amended to read:

29.191 There shall be no close season for hook and line fishing, except for large and small-mouthed bass, sturgeon and trout, in any of the following described waters: In the waters of the Mississippi river, the bays and bayous connected therewith and in the waters of La Fayette and Iowa counties; in the waters of Lake Winnebago in Fond du Lac, Calumet and Winnebago counties; in Buffalo lake, Marquette county; in Puckaway lake in Marquette and Green Lake counties; in Lake Poygan in Winnebago and Waushara counties; in Lakes Winneconne, Big and Little Butte des Morts in Winnebago county; in the Fox river in Marquette, Green Lake, Waushara, Winnebago and Columbia counties except where it flows through Park lake (in which general laws shall be applicable); in the Wolf river in *Shawano*, Winnebago, Outagamie and Waupaca counties; in the Rock and

Crawfish rivers and in Lake Ripley and Lake Koshkonong in Rock, Jefferson and Dodge counties. There shall be no close season for hook and line fishing in Park lake in Columbia county and in Lake Wisconsin in Columbia and Sauk counties for perch, bluegills, sunfish, crappies and bullheads. There shall be no close season for fishing through the ice with hook and line for fish of any variety in the waters of the Mississippi river, and the lakes, bays, bayous and sloughs thereof, or in the waters of Allouez bay, Superior Bay, St. Louis bay and St. Louis river connected with Lake Superior; the quantity and minimum length of fish so taken shall be as prescribed in section 29.19, and such fish shall not be sold. In the Lemonweir river in Juneau county the open season for pickerel, bullheads and sunfish shall begin on April fifteenth.

SECTION 2. Paragraph (o) of (1) of 29.28 (amended by chapter 98, Laws 1933) is repealed.

SECTION 3. Paragraph (p) of (2) of 29.28 (created by chapter 98, Laws 1933) and (j) of (2g) of 29.28 (created by chapter 98, Laws 1933), are repealed. Paragraph (1) of (1) of 29.28 (amended by chapter 98, Laws 1933) is amended to read: (1) Oneida county: * * * all waters.

SECTION 4. Subsection (2) of section 50.07, as amended by chapter 277, Laws 1933, is renumbered paragraph (a) of said subsection and re-enacted, and paragraph (b) of (2), as created by chapter 234, Laws 1933, is re-enacted.

SECTION 5. Subsection (5) of section 59.98, as amended by chapter 128, Laws 1933, is amended by striking the words "or town clerk".

SECTION 6. The amendment made to section 66.04 (7) by chapter 170, Laws 1933, is not repealed by chapter 175. Both amendments stand. The purpose of this enactment is to declare that the later act did not repeal the earlier one.

SECTION 7. Subsection (2) of section 72.04, as amended by chapter 275, Laws 1933, is amended to read:

(72.04) (2) Property of the clear value of fifteen thousand dollars transferred to the widow of the decedent, *five thousand dollars transferred to the husband of the decedent*, and two thousand dollars transferred to each of the other persons described in subsection (1) of section 72.02 shall be exempt. Such exemption to the widow shall include all her statutory and other allowances. Any child of the decedent shall be entitled to credit for so much of the tax paid by the widow as applied to any of the same prop-

erty which hereafter shall be transferred by or from such widow to such child, provided the widow does not survive said decedent to exceed six years, and provided, further, that where other property is also transferred by or from the widow to any such child, then such credit shall be applied only upon that portion of the total tax assessed against such child as is attributable to the property transferred upon which a tax was paid by the widow, such portion to be ascertained by the ratio that the property transferred upon which a tax was paid by the widow bears to the total amount of property transferred.

SECTION 8. Section 102.45 of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 9. The amendment made to section 157.11 (9) (b) by chapter 134, Laws 1933, is not repealed by chapter 246. Both amendments stand. The purpose of this enactment is to declare that the later act did not repeal the earlier one.

SECTION 10. Subsection (8) of section 208.25, as enacted in section 25 of chapter 344, Laws 1933, is amended by substituting therein "208.31" for "208.24".

SECTION 11. Subsection (1) of section 326.01, as amended by chapter 253, Laws of 1933, is amended in the ninth line by inserting "been" after "have."

SECTION 12. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 455.

AN ACT to repeal and to recreate subsection (1) of section 30.02 and to amend subsection (17) of section 66.06 of the statutes, relating to the creation of shore and dock lines on navigable waters by municipalities.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 30.02 of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 2. A new subsection is added to section 30.02 of the statutes to be numbered and to read: (30.02) (1) (a) Every municipality, except counties and cities having a population of three hundred thousand or more, may, subject to the approval of the public service commission, by ordinance establish both a shore
