CHAPTER 587

AN ACT to create 20.550 (36) of the statutes, relating to the classification and compensation plan adopted by the joint committee on finance for positions in the competitive division of the classified service, and making an appropriation.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

20.550 (36) of the statutes is created to read:

20.550 (36) SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS; SALARY ADJUSTMENTS.

There is appropriated to the various state departments as defined in s. 16.02 (6) from the respective funds from which state employes' and officers' salaries are paid, for the biennium beginning July 1, 1957, a sum sufficient to supplement the respective appropriations of said state departments in the amount necessary to pay the cost of salary adjustments approved in the classification and compensation plan adopted by the joint committee on finance for positions in the competitive division of the classified service.

(a) Upon certification of the department head or officer to the director of budget and accounts together with such additional information as may be required, the director shall forthwith determine the sum of money necessary from the appropriation provided in this subsection for the salary adjustments approved in the new classification and compensation plan for the employes of the various departments of state government, and the director of budget and accounts shall thereupon supplement, at such times and in such amounts as he shall determine, the respective appropriations of the state departments defined in s. 16.02 (6) and including those appropriations in which receipts are appropriated or reappropriated wherein the director shall determine whether a supplementary appropriation is necessary therefor.

(b) Any department feeling itself aggrieved by the action of the director of budget and accounts under this subsection, may appeal such action to the governor, who, after whatever investigation he deems necessary, may set aside or modify such action.
