Know you by these presents:

Whereas, God in His Wisdom has summoned to eternal rest Bishop Stanislaus V. Bona, 79, spiritual leader for more than 300,000 Roman Catholics in the Green Bay diocese since 1945. Bishop Bona died on December 1, 1967, after a long illness. And;

Whereas Bishop Bona, born in Chicago on October 1, 1888, was the son of a Polish immigrant foundry worker. He was one of nine children. He graduated from St. Stanislaus College in Chicago, attended the Propaganda University and the North American University in Rome, and received doctorate degrees in philosophy and theology, and a licentiate in canon law. He was ordained in 1912 and served, before he became Bishop of Green Bay, as pastor of St. Casimir's Church in Chicago and, from 1932 to 1945, as bishop of the Grand Island, Nebr., diocese. And;

Whereas, Bishop Bona was not only a great churchman but also a great citizen. We in state government admired his intelligence and good judgment, his dedication to the church, and his ability to take an active part in community affairs; now, therefore,

Dear Mr. Struebing: With reference to your letter of transmittal November 13, 1967, I would appreciate the following report spread upon the Journal:

In response to **Assembly Resolution 28**, adopted November 10, 1967, I wish to report that the Monona Avenue, Wisconsin Avenue, and West Washington Avenue driveways in Capitol Park have been resurfaced with an application of asphalt toppedressed with a layer of rolled limestone chips. This treatment provides sufficient traction for pedestrian and vehicular safety.

The contract for this work was initiated upon receipt of **Assembly Resolution 28** by the Department of Administration, but inclement weather delayed completion of the project to its present stage until November 26, 1967. The East Washington Avenue approach and necessary touch-up of the other three driveways will be done with the advent of warm weather in the Spring. The East Washington Avenue drive is at grade and constitutes a lesser hazard, so it was accorded the lowest priority.
