To the Honorable, the Assembly:

I am returning **Assembly Bill 825** to you without approval.

This bill provides for the payment to Legislators residing in Dane County of transportation expenses to and from the

JOURNAL OF THE ASSEMBLY [December 12, 1967]

Capitol each day while the Legislature is in session or when it is in recess for less than one month's duration. It also provides for the reimbursement for the expenses incurred for meals for each day a Dane County Legislator is in Madison on legislative business. The expenses are limited to \$75 per month for each Legislator.

Section 20.940, Wisconsin Statutes, provides that all state officers and employees shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary traveling expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties, but also provides that no such traveling or other expenses shall be allowed to those who actually reside in the City of Madison while attending meetings in Madison.

This bill provides travel and meal expenses for Legislators who reside within the City of Madison and specifically exempts them from the restriction set forth in section 20.940. The problems of reimbursing state employees (including Legislators) for legitimate expenses incurred in the state's business is not resolved by this bill, but rather, it creates an inequitable differentiation between Legislators and other officers and employees of the state residing within the Capitol City. The current restriction is unfair under certain conditions, and has led to some attempts to bypass it, by equally undesirable techniques such as scheduling meetings outside of the city limits of Madison or by charging "conference fees" as a means of expense reimbursement. I would rather see this subject dealt with forthrightly, and would encourage legislation which deals with the subject in an equitable manner for all.

It would appear that the Legislators from Dane County also have some concern over this proposal since each voted against the bill when it was considered in their respective houses.
