CHAPTER 25, Laws of 1971

AN ACT to amend 13.54 (1) of the statutes, relating to the membership of the interstate cooperation commission.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

13.54 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

13.54 (1) There is created a commission on interstate cooperation in the legislative branch to consist of the members of the joint committee on legislative organization and, in addition, 3 senators and 3 representatives to the assembly appointed as are standing committees in the respective houses, the chief of the legislative reference bureau, the governor and 3 state officials to be appointed by him. The executive secretary of the legislative council shall serve as the nonvoting secretary of the commission. Subject to approval by the joint committee on legislative organization, each member of the joint committee may nominate another legislator of his house and political party to serve on the interstate cooperation commission in his place as an alternate voting member. Subject to s. 14.40 (6), alternates to attend specific meetings may be chosen as are persons to fill vacancies, and their terms shall expire when their mission is accomplished.
