The senate was called to order by the president of the senate.

The appointment by the Governor of James C. Runde, of Cuba City, as a member of the Board of Agriculture, to succeed Robert E. Tracy, to serve for a term ending May 1, 1977.

Senator Swan moved that the appointment of James C. Runde be re-referred to the committee on Agriculture.

By request of Senator Murphy, the appointment of John A. Zinos was re-referred to the committee on Commerce, Labor, Taxation, Insurance and Banking.

By request of Senator McKenna, with unanimous consent, the senate adjourned in honor of the Twenty-Fifth Wedding Anniversary of Mr. and Mrs. Gideon Travis of Pawtucket, Rhode Island.
