**Editor's Note:** The basic legal structure relied upon by the U. Statutes relating to powers and duties of director of division of departmental research and director of purchases do not grant any powers of reviewing discretion of the conservation commission in making expenditures of income from the area in accordance with terms of lease. 29 Atty.
