A Proclamation

Relating to making various changes concerning courts, making appropriations and granting rule-making authority.

A Proclamation

I, Martin J. Schreiber, Acting Governor of the State of Wisconsin, under and by virtue of Section 11 of Article IV of the Constitution of Wisconsin, which provides that the Governor shall have power to convene the legislature on extraordinary occasions, do issue this, my proclamation expanding the purposes for which the legislature of the state shall convene at the seat of government at Madison, on the thirteenth day of June, A.D., 1978, at ten o'clock a.m., to include, along with the consideration of the legislative business specified in my proclamation of the twenty-sixth day of May, A.D., 1978, the following additional subject of legislative business, to wit:

Increasing the housing value limitations for the veterans home loan program to \$52,500 on or after June 13, 1978, and to \$55,000 after January 1, 1979.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this thirteenth day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-eight.
