Appendix to **Senate Bill 112**

Public Policy Involved

In total, the provisions of **Senate Bill 112** relating to disability determination under the two teacher funds appear to be good public policy. It should be noted that **Assembly Bill 109** (Merger bill) would also accomplish this purpose and contains similar provisions for disability determination -- but under a unified Wisconsin Retirement System. It should also be noted that **Senate Bill 79** (the biennial budget bill) repeals the sum sufficient to Health and Social Services for the program responsibilities related to the teacher fund disability programs. However, **Senate Bill 112** should perhaps be amended to repeal s.20.435(5) of the statutes relating to the sum sufficient appropriation to Health and Social Services and also amend s.15.191 (intro) to delete references to Health and Social Services' responsibilities for disability determination under the two teacher funds. These amendments are contained in senate amendment 1 to **Senate Bill 112**.
