GOVERNOR'S VETO MESSAGE

August 13, 1981

To the Honorable, the Assembly:

I am returning Assembly Bill 406 because it no longer is necessary. This was back up legislation in case the budget was not passed promptly.

The language of the budget bill, which has now become law, not only accomplishes the objectives of AB 406 but goes further. The budget bill provides funds for the transfer of Wisconsin prisoners under the interstate corrections compact and allows the Department of Health and Social Services greater flexibility in deciding how many prisoners to transfer to Minnesota. It meets our needs for implementing this temporary tool to relieve the serious overcrowding of our prisons. Again I commend the Legislature for dealing with this issue in a timely and straightforward way.
