Relating to the tax on liquor manufactured in this state by pollution control facilities from brewing wastes and to a floor tax on intoxicating liquors, a surtax added in 1982 and 1983 to the corporate income and franchise taxes, depreciation on leased property, redefining the internal revenue code for the purpose of computing the income taxes of individuals, trusts and estates, the definition of "internal revenue code" as it relates to powers of appointment, employe benefit plans and extensions for filing inheritance taxes, the definition of "internal revenue code" for insurers, regulated investment companies and real estate investment trusts, the sales tax on telephone and telegraph services, computing depreciation on utility property for purposes of the corporate income and franchise taxes, a county sales and use tax, the cigarette tax, transfer of moneys or positions between certain appropriations made to state agencies, state compensation and fringe benefit supplements, various changes to the 1979-81 and 1981-83 authorized state building programs, payment of interest on moneys temporarily reallocated, limiting the compensation of a nonrepresented state classified employe who, in lieu of layoff, is demoted or exercises displacement rights, limiting compensation of a nonrepresented state classified employe restored, after layoff, to a position with a lower pay range, cumulative pay adjustments for certain nonrepresented state classified employes, a salary freeze for certain state employes, work hour and pay reductions for nonrepresented state employes, work-related programs for recipients of aid to families with dependent children, the expenditure of federal child welfare funds, making permanent the 2nd opinion program in medical assistance, kidney disease aids, the reimbursement for handicapped education special rates transportation and health treatment aidable costs, decreasing the primary guaranteed valuation for 1982-83 school aids and delaying part of the June 1982 aid payment until July 1982, the renewable energy resource system incentive program, granting rule-making

authority, providing penalties and decreasing and making appropriations.
