REPORT OF JOINT SURVEY COMMITTEE ON DEBT MANAGEMENT

Appendix to Senate Bill 692

Public Policy Involved

The proposal is desirable as a matter of public policy.

It should be noted that Ch. 20, Laws of 1981, the Biennial Budget Act, provides an authorized level of bond revenues for mental health facilities of \$7,154,000. In SEC. 2006, which lists the authorized state building program, Governor Lee Sherman Dreyfus vetoed the Northern Center laundry remodeling project (\$1,875,000) and the Southern Center waste water treatment plant renovation (\$279,000). This total amount is \$2,150,000. This unused bonding authority is to be used for the purpose of the Goodland Hall renovations.

The legislature has not yet acted on the governor's veto of these specific projects. If the legislature should override the governor's veto, then SEC. 2 of the bill is necessary to provide an increased amount of appropriations to the Building Commission. If the legislature does not override the governor's veto, SEC. 2 would be unnecessary.

The proposal states, on page 2, lines 3 and 4, that the remodeling is to be financed from unused bonding authority. If that is the intent, SEC. 2 is unnecessary.

If the legislature wishes to provide for the contingency that the governor's veto of the above projects will be overridden, then SEC. 2 should remain in the bill. However, the word "unused" on page 2, line 3, should then be deleted.

If the legislature does not wish to provide for the contingency of the governor's veto being overridden and intends that the project is to be financed only from unused bonding authority from the present authorized level, then SEC. 2 of the bill should be deleted.
