A Proclamation

I, Lee Sherman Dreyfus, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do hereby expand the purposes for which the Legislature convened in special session at the Capitol in Madison on the 6th day of April, A.D., 1982, to include along with the consideration of the legislative business specified in my proclamation of the 5th day of April, A.D., 1982, the following additional subject of legislative business, to wit:

Reinstatement of the 5% trigger for unemployment compensation Extended Benefits.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this 7th day of April in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty-two.
