Relating to earmarking not less than 40% of any state sales or use taxes for education property tax relief (first consideration).

Read first time.

By request of Senator Bablitch, with unanimous consent, the rules were suspended and **Assembly Joint Resolution 1, Special Session** was read a second time.

Senate amendment 1 offered by Senators Klecka and Offner.
