*A Proclamation*

I, Lee Sherman Dreyfus, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, do hereby require the convening of a special session of the Legislature to take place at the Capitol in Madison on Wednesday, the 26th day of May, A.D., 1982, at 10:00 A.M., solely for the purpose of considering and acting upon the following specific pieces of legislative business, to-wit:

1. Making emergency telephone number systems optional instead of mandatory.
2. Salary adjustments for judicial officers.
3. Eligibility for relief to needy Indian persons.
4. Property tax exemption for logging equipment.
5. Extension of time limits for compliance with effluent limitation for publicly owned treatment plants.
6. Early retirement for state employees.
7. Submission to the electorate of the amendment to the Constitution approved in 1981 Enrolled Joint Resolution 29.
8. Adoptive placements and investigations; clarifying the method of computing general school aid for the 1981-82 school year; revisions of the laws governing the Wisconsin Retirement System; and frequency of wage payment to unclassified employees of the UW System.
