"The first nationally known Black poet in America was Paul Laurence Dunbar. Born in 1872 of ex-slave parentage, he had his first poem published in a local newspaper when he was 16 years old. At 21, he published his first book of poems, <u>Oaks and Ivory</u>. His poetry was well received by both Blacks and whites alike. The then reigning critic of American letters, William Dean Howells, praised Dunbar highly and in 1896, wrote the preface to Dunbar's second volume of poetry, <u>Lyrics of Lowly Life</u>. This contained his best work and remains his best known. It contained humorous poems in the quaint dialect of the newly freed slaves.

Dunbar's work brought him a position as reader in the Library of Congress; a great distinction for a Black man in those days. Mr. Dunbar is well known for his travels to Black educational centers; giving readings and inspiring other Blacks with his personal magnetism.

Paul Laurence Dunbar was a brilliant poet, but more importantly, he had the ability to reach out beyond color lines to enlighten all people on the Black experience.

Allow me to share with you a tidbit from Dunbar's pen. A short verse which illustrates the pride he felt in his race.

'Be proud my race, in mind and soul; Thy name is writ on glory's scroll In characters of fire. High 'mid the cloud of fame's bright sky Thy banners' blasoned folds now fly. In truth shall lift them higher'."
