Assembly Bill 526

Engrossed Senate Bill 83

In engrossing, the following text (as shown by the drafting records for Senate Substitute Amendment 1 to 1983 Senate Bill 83, and Senate Amendment 44 thereto) was inadvertently omitted.

1. Page 653, line 34: after that line insert:

"(cm) 1. Subject to subd. 2, a person enrolled in a health care plan which limits participation in it to providers selected by the health care plan, but which is not sponsored by a health maintenance organization as defined in sub. (2m) (a), may obtain covered health care services from a provider not selected by the health care plan.

2. The health care plan may limit coverage of health care services obtained under subd. 1 to health care services performed by a provider not selected by the plan but who is willing to participate in the plan and abide by its terms.

3. Subject to subds. 2 and 4, the health care plan shall pay for covered health care services obtained under subd. 1.

4. The health care plan may require the person to pay up to 20% of the cost of covered health care services obtained under subd. 1. The total payment by the person and the health care plan may not be less than the payment the health care plan would make for comparable health care services performed by a provider selected by the health care plan.

(d) An employer may not offer to its employes a health care plan which limits participation in it to providers selected by the health care plan unless it also offers at least one other health care plan which provides substantially equivalent medical and hospital benefits and which does not limit participation in it to providers selected by the health care plan, and gives the employes the opportunity to choose between the health care plans at least once annually. This paragraph does not apply to a health maintenance organization as defined in sub. (2m) (a).

(e) No provider may be required to participate exclusively in any health care plan as a condition of participation in it, but a provider may be denied the opportunity to participate in any health care plan for cause related to the practice of his or her profession.

(f) The commissioner may adopt rules requiring health care plans limiting participation to selected providers to disclose to consumers that only a limited selection of providers is available.

(g) Section 632.87 controls in the event of conflict with this subsection.".
