EXECUTIVE COMMUNICATIONS

Executive Order Number 86

- I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Section 11 of Article IV and Section 4 of Article V of the Constitution of Wisconsin, require the convening of a special session of the Legislature at the Capitol in Madison, beginning on November 20, 1985 at 10:00 a.m. solely to consider and act upon the following specific legislative business:
 - 1. Tentative agreements between the State of Wisconsin and:
 - a. State of Wisconsin Education Professionals, AFT, WFT, Local 3271, AFL-CIO, covering employees in the professional education bargaining unit,
 - b. District 1199W/United Professionals for Quality Health Care, covering employees in the professional patient care collective bargaining unit,
 - c. Wisconsin State Employees Union, AFSCME Council 24, and its appropriate affiliated locals, AFL-CIO, covering employees in the clerical and related, the blue collar and nonbuilding trades, the security and public safety, the technical, the professional research, statistics and analysis and the professional social services bargaining units,
 - d. Wisconsin Science Professionals, AFT, Local 3732, covering employees in the professional science bargaining unit,
 - e. Wisconsin State Attorneys Association, Inc., covering employees in the professional legal bargaining unit,
 - f. State Engineering Association, covering employees in the professional legal bargaining unit.

2. Closing state offices and granting non-represented state employees a paid holiday for observance of the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., payment of retirement benefit adjustment contributions for non-represented state employees and repealing provisions prohibiting proposals for and payment of length of service payments to non-represented employees.
