The Governor vetoed requirements that \$3,000,000 of the authorized borrowing be spent for specified acquistions. It is suggested that s. 20.866 (2) (ts), Stats., as affected by Act 27, be amended to eliminate \$3,000,000 of borrowing authority for which there is no specified purpose.

The borrowing related provisions of the bill are desirable as a matter of public policy.
