State of Wisconsin Office of the Governor

To the Honorable, the Senate:

I have approved Senate Bill 364 as Wisconsin Act 295 and deposited it in the Office of the Secretary of State. In approving the bill I have also exercised my partial veto authority.

I have partially vetoed the language in Section 8 which specifically outlines legislative intent for future park maintenance funding. This section states that the intent of the legislature is to provide funding of \$15 million for maintenance and development, \$5 million for

recreation facilities, and a minimum of \$1.8 million for maintenance and development of trails over a five year period from July 1, 1988 to June 30, 1993.

I have vetoed this language because I believe it is inappropriate. The \$5 million provided in this bill for 1988-89 is a substantial increase over the current funding available for parks maintenance. It would be inappropriate to assume that this level of funding should be continued without further analysis. Parks maintenance funding should be reviewed like other state programs during each budget process and evaluated on the basis of need and the state's fiscal condition.

I support funding to maintain our park system. Senate Bill 364, with my veto, provides a responsible and sufficient commitment of funds for that purpose. I am pleased to sign this bill into law to help some of Wisconsin's greatest resources.
