Senate Bill 7, effective December 1, 1987, mandated use of safety belts for motor vehicle operators and passengers. Within the legislation a number of motor vehicles were exempt from safety belt usage, such as authorized emergency vehicles operated by enforcement officers, taxicabs, rural letter carriers, land surveying crews, and large school busess (Type I) having a gross weight of more than 10,000 pounds. Small school buses are already equipped with passenger seat belts, and they must be worn. Type I (large) school buses are not equipped with seat belts for passengers.

This legislation directed the Department of Public Instruction to do a study to evaluate the feasibility of installing and using seat belts for passengers in large school buses (Type I). The Department of Public Instruction was directed to report this study to the presiding officer of each house of the legislature by July 1, 1988.

Therefore, I am including two copies of the completed study for your utilization.
